

Aquatic Facilities Handout

John Chavis Memorial Park Pool

- City's oldest pool built in 1979 to replace the original WPA-era outdoor pool
- Shallow water depth will not allow for competitive swimming events
- Main pool is 25 yards (7,350 sq. ft).
- 1994 bathhouse renovated and 1979 spray pool removed
- 1997 pool shell renovated and current spray ground added
- 2012 new fence installed, bathhouse painted to coordinate with the carousel house, new FRP doors installed

Current Aquatic Planning

- Current trend is to create multi-featured facilities tailored to the needs of various user groups:
 - o recreational swimmers
 - fitness swimmers
 - \circ aquatic therapy users
 - \circ competitive swimmers
 - o instructional

Aquatic Planning Considerations

- recreation/leisure vs. competition/training
- indoor vs. outdoor
- desired aquatic features
- gaps within the citywide aquatic programming
- availability of features at nearby facilities
- site constraints (such as available level land area) that can dictate size of aquatic facility and parking
- budget, cost and recapture rates





Neighborhood Family Aquatic Center

- Leisure pool with zero-beach entry (5,467 ft²)
- 3 fitness lap lanes
- Tot pool with slide (700 ft²)
- Play features (water slide, a participatory play feature, climb across bridges, otter slide)
- Five shade structures, bathhouse, snack bar, two family changing rooms, and locker rooms.

Medium Family Aquatic Center

- Leisure pool with zero-beach $(9,200 \text{ ft}^2)$
- 6-lane, 25 yard pool with two diving boards.
- Play features (two water slides, colorful "wet playground" provides climbing opportunities as well as operating valves, sprays, and slides for hands-on activities, tumble buckets, an otter slide)
- A current river
- Tot pool with slide (700 ft²)
- Eight shade structures, bathhouse, snack bar, two family changing rooms, and locker rooms.

Large Family Aquatic Center

- Leisure pool (heated) with zero-beach (13,300 ft²)
- 2 water slides, participatory play feature, tumble buckets and current river
- 50 meter competitive pool, two diving boards and 800 spectator seats (can accommodate training)
- Tot pool with slide and gentle spray feature (2,000 ft²)
- Pavilion, bathhouse, twelve shade structures, bathhouse, snack bar, two family changing rooms, and locker rooms.

Bundled Indoor / Outdoor Community Aquatic Center

(with access to an existing or future community center) Indoor:

- 8-lane 25 yard competitive pool, two diving boards and 125 spectator seats.
- Leisure pool (5,800 ft²) with participatory play features, water slide, current channel, and water vortex.
- 3 fitness lap lanes
- 300 square foot spa.

Outdoor:

- Leisure pool with three fitness lap lanes, two water slides, a participatory play feature, current river, otter slide, tumble buckets (9,200 ft²)
- Tot pool with slide (700 ft²)
- 6 shade structures, bathhouse, two family changing rooms, locker rooms, and snack bar.

Bundled Indoor / Outdoor Training Center

Year-round family indoor training and outdoor recreation

Indoor:
50 meter pool, four diving boards and 400 spectator seats.

Outdoor:

- Leisure pool with two water slides, a participatory play feature, current channel, otter slide, tumble buckets (11,175 ft²)
- Tot pool with slide (700 ft²)
- Eight shade structures

Indoor Competition Venue

- 50 meter x 25 yard competitive pool, four diving boards and 400 spectator seats.
- Leisure pool with fitness lap lanes, water slide, a participatory play feature, current channel, water vortex (6,800 ft²)
- Tot pool with slide (700 ft²)
- 8 shade structures, snack bar, meeting room, locker rooms and family changing room.
